

Submission guidelines for authors

Articles are welcome comprising between 4000 and 8000 words, in case of a book-review 3000 words. All manuscripts (hard copies or emailed in .doc, .wpd, .rtf, or .pdf) should be accompanied by an abstract of not more than 150 words.

Style Notes

Communio viatorum uses footnotes, not endnotes, and does not use bold or underline in its format. Use italics to indicate emphasis.

Periods and commas are inside quotation marks.

Use one space, not two, between sentences.

In general, do not capitalize after a colon.

If the article is divided into sections, please number them. Capitalize only the first word of the section title.

When citing Scripture, use the RSV abbreviations in English and Einheitsübersetzung in German

Use *ibid.*, *id.*, *i.e.*, and *e.g.* (not italicized.)

Do not italicize foreign phrases that are commonly used, e.g., *vis-à-vis*, *Zeitgeist*, *a priori*.

Please provide the full first and last name of authors in citations, if possible.

Please provide the city, publishing company, and year of publication in citations. (San Francisco: Ignatius Press, 1988)

Footnotes should be formatted as follows:

A monograph

Karel A. DEURLOO, *Exodus a exil : malá biblická teologie*, Eman: Benešov, 2007, pp. 1-20. In case of an ontology: Jan A.DUS (ed.), *Proroctví a apokalypsy: novozákonní apokryfy III*, Praha 2007. Subsequent references use the author's last name, the title (shortened, if appropriate), and page reference, e.g. DEURLOO, *Exodus a exil*, p. 20.

A selection from a book

Hans M.BARSTAD, *History and the Hebrew Bible*, in: Lester L. GRABBE, *Can a 'History of Israel' be Written?*, Sheffield Accademic Press: Sheffield, 1997, pp. 37-64. Subsequent reference BARSTAD, *History*, p.40.

An article in a journal

Jürgen MOLTSMANN, The Resurrection of Christ and the New Earth, in: *Communio viatorum* 49 (2007/2), pp. 141-149. Subsequent reference MOLTSMANN, The Resurrection, p.149.
